AEA branches across the country launched joint auctions on Oct. 2. The auctions featured the first public appearance of the adorable and friendly mascot "Pi-Bao," whose presence aroused more interest from participating people in buying things while shortening the distance between the AEA branches and the general public. The buying sentiment went up as a result. Revenue from conclusion of the auction reached NT\$122,395,597, setting a new record.

Real estate items that were auctioned off fetched NT\$117,623,002. They included: a big luxury farmhouse in Hukou Township, Hsinchu County, which the Hsinchu branch auctioned off items for NT\$11.51 million, as well as a townhouse in downtown Toufen City, Miaoli County, and a motel in Tongluo Township, Miaoli County, which were auctioned off for NT\$36.03 million plus in total; 6 lots of land and buildings on Ruilong Road in Qianzhen District, Kaohsiung City, which the Kaohsiung branch auctioned off for NT\$25.77 million. What a remarkable performance!

AEA branches across the county put on auction a wide variety of movable properties, which earned NT\$4,772,595 for the government.

The Taipei branch auctioned off a helmet of ancient Tibetan King Gelsall,

5 ink paintings by renowned painter Shen Lyu-sui, famous for his horse paintings, 4 watercolor paintings by Cheng Hsiang-long, and bottles of Golden Dragon-Peony-class Kinmen Kaoliang liquor for NT\$1.36 million. The Taichung branch auctioned off production equipment for battery modules for a solar power system, a Mazda SUV and Isuzu light truck for NT\$2.42 million plus.

The Kaohsiung branch auctioned off a KIA sedan, Piaggio motorcycle, and Volvo tour bus for NT\$210,000 plus.

Other items that were also auctioned off included Guzheng string instruments, tea, amethyst, dark-red enameled pottery and imported liquor. You name it. We have it.

Offering so many items at bargain prices, the joint auctions helped members of the public get a good deal. They also retrieved huge amounts of unpaid taxes and fines for the government.
